

BRATTLEBORO VERMONTERSM

The **Round and Black mountains** offer ample hiking opportunities around Brattleboro, while the **Connecticut River** cuts through the town's heart, lending a lively atmosphere to a historic downtown lined with storied architecture and brick buildings. Visit the **Brattleboro Museum & Art Center**—located in Brattleboro's historic train station—for a unique cultural experience, or take in a live show at the **Stone Church**, hosting everything from intimate folk gatherings to rambunctious metal bands.



Stay at the Latchis Hotel, an art deco hotel with a Greek twist and only a 5-minute walk from the train station.



Dine at the Whetstone Station Restaurant and Brewery, voted Vermont's Great American Beer Bar and easily walkable from the hotel.

WATERBURY VERMONTERSM

Waterbury has earned a reputation for being a foodie and outdoor recreation mecca. Downtown, **The Phoenix**, with its soda fountain, candy shop, gallery, and live music space, beckons artists and those looking for inspiration. **Waterbury Sports** rents what you need to shred the **Perry Hill mountain biking trail** network, tour Waterbury's rolling dirt roads on two wheels, or snowshoe the **Cross Vermont trail** network.



Stay at the Old Stagecoach Inn, a historic bed and breakfast in the heart of Waterbury Village built in 1846 that might just have some ghost stories of its own.



Dine at Hen of the Wood, renowned statewide for its hyperlocal and handcrafted menu heavily influenced by what's in season.



The **VERMONTER™** makes nine stops in Vermont after traveling through Connecticut and Massachusetts.

BURLINGTON ETHAN ALLEN EXPRESS® ESSEX JUNCTION VERMONTERSM

Visit the **Church Street Marketplace** for an array of dining and shopping in downtown Burlington, take in a show at the historic **Flynn Theatre**, or go for a sail or paddle on **Lake Champlain**.



Stay at Hotel Vermont, just steps away from the Church Street Marketplace with an in-house gym and two restaurants to satisfy your inner foodie.



Dine at Honey Road where the James Beard nominated chef, Cara Chigazola Tobin, showcases eastern Mediterranean cuisine.

Notes: The Burlington Station is located right on the Lake Champlain waterfront and is within walking distance to a variety of hotels, restaurants, and attractions.

The Essex Junction Station is located about 7 miles outside of Burlington. We recommend reserving a taxi ahead of time to bring you into Burlington or taking the bus which will bring you directly to downtown Burlington.

MIDDLEBURY ETHAN ALLEN EXPRESS

Take in a show at the **Town Hall Theater**, visit **Middlebury College Museum of Art**, and explore the **Trail Around Middlebury**, nearly 30 miles of historic trails for hiking and biking.



Stay at the Middlebury Inn, a historic New England hotel dating back to 1827, just a short walk to Middlebury's downtown.



Dine at Fire & Ice, locally and family owned since 1974, doubles as a restaurant and a museum.
